Experiencing Signal Delays?

Members who have the new Beacon cell meters and use the Eye on Water app have told us they experienced delays in updating their water usage and alerts. The problem lies with the metal cans and lids, which interfere with the cell signal. If an Entranosa service technician raises the cell antenna a few





inches out of the can, members usually receive clearer cell reception. If members are experiencing data delays, call Entranosa and we will send a technician to come and raise your antenna.

Non Professionals, Stay out of Meters!



Getting into your meter can and leaving the lid open can cause serious problems, including winter

freezing and summer rattlesnakes. Please call Entranosa's team of professionals to help you if you need your water turned off.

If you encounter a rattlesnake in your meter can or anywhere in your yard, leave it alone! Most rattlesnake bites occur when people or dogs provoke the snake. Rattlesnakes only bite out of self-defense, so the best way to avoid a bite is to leave it alone. Allow it to leave the area before returning.
